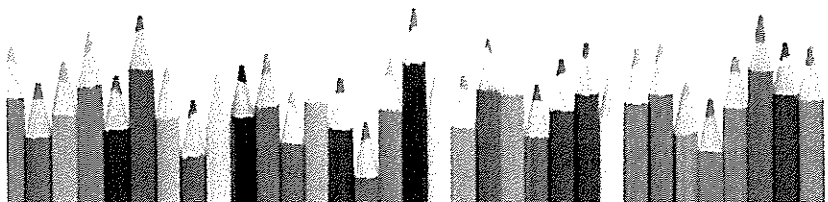


Green Team Officers Elected
